Note from the Editor

It gives me immense pleasure to present the Summer 2013 edition of the *CLAWS Journal*, a theme-based issue specifically focussing on building capacities so as to enhance the combat potential of the Army for conventional and sub-conventional conflict, in harmony with the Navy and the Air Force. Given the unremitting continuity in the patterns of threats and power equations in the region, long-term defence planning becomes a fundamentally indispensable prerequisite. More significantly, we have endeavoured to suggest corrective actions to be taken, ultimately resulting in overall capability enhancement. The *Journal* includes indepth articles and commentaries on the subject, furthering enrichment and sharpening focus of the discourse.

Besides, non-theme articles in this edition include an assessment of North Korea's renewed nuclear brinkmanship and the changing nature of geo-strategic equations in Northeast Asia, an Indian take on China's latest defence White Paper, and a review of the internal armed conflict in India amidst the need of forging a joint civil-military approach.

The Editorial Team hopes that this issue of the *CLAWS Journal* will contribute towards the overall thinking regarding the issues elaborated above, and I await your feedback and comments.
